## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on CMS Waivers, Flexibilities, and the End of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

The Department of Health and Human Services is planning for the federal Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 (PHE), declared under Section 319 of the Public Health Service Act, to expire at the end of the day on May 11, 2023. Today, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued <u>FAQs on CMS Waivers</u>, <u>Flexibilities</u>, <u>and the End of the COVID-19 PHE</u>. The FAQs will help you prepare for the expiration of the COVID-19 PHE and are relevant for all CMS programs; including, Medicare, Medicaid, the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and private insurance.
